From Tall Ceilings to Long Rooms



Location

Immigration Museum is a reimagining of Old Customs House, one of Melbourne's most significant 19th century buildings. Architecturally, the building connects grand Victorian design with modern detail-from the original bluestone vaults to the transparent Atrium overlooking our sunny Courtyard and Tribute Garden. We are a few steps from Collins Street trams and Flinders Lane car parking, a short walk from the city's major rail hubs and a quick stroll from Southbank and the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre.


Atrium


